Answer the Call. Join Middlesex Centre Fire Services.

As a Probationary Volunteer Firefighter, you'll join a dedicated team of professionals who are responsible for:

- » fire suppression
- » rescue
- » tiered medical response, and
- » public education and prevention.
- To be successful in this role, you must:
- » Have a strong desire to serve the community.
- » Be able to participate in weekly training and truck checks.
- » Live and/or work in close proximity to one of Middlesex Centre's five fire stations.
 The expectation from paging to arriving on-scene in most cases is not more than 10 minutes.

Firefighters receive professional-level training and equipment to support their work. If you join the fire service, you'll be compensated based on the hours you spend in training, public education and emergency response.

Position Requirements

- » Be 18 years of age or older and legally entitled to work in Canada
- » Possess an Ontario High School Graduation Diploma or equivalent
- » Possess a valid and unrestricted Ontario Class "G" driver's license or equivalent
- » Have or be willing to attain a Ontario Class "D" driver's license with "Z" endorsement within one year or as available (initial costs paid for by the municipality)
- Have or be willing to complete the NFPA 1001 Level I and II and NFPA 1002 program within one year or as available (costs paid for by the municipality)
- Willing to complete Firefighter Services of Ontario clinical and medical assessments including physical aptitude, acrophobia, and claustrophobia assessments (costs paid for by the municipality)
- » Provide a clear driver's abstract, and criminal record and vulnerable sector check
- Provide proof of immunization from COVID-19, Red Measles, Mumps, Rubella (German Measles), Tetanus/Diphtheria and Hepatitis B (within Health Canada suggested time frames)
