Why is the municipality preparing a 5-year strategic plan?

Leadership

People expect leadership from their governments. Gone are the days when citizens expect their governments just to react to crises. People want to influence the future of their community.

Engagement

People want to be consulted and heard about local issues that affect them, such as land use changes. And residents and businesses want to be engaged more broadly in charting a course for the future. Preparedness

Unless priorities are consciously established and communicated, everyone gets disappointed and disillusioned.

Strategic planning means finding that difficult balance between what might be desirable and good for the Middlesex Centre, on the one hand, and what's likely to be possible and affordable, on the other hand.

For Council, a good strategic planning process helps it to find common ground, take wise initiative, and feel a sense of achievement. The plan puts staff "on the same page" as Council when they do their annual budgets and work plans. It often challenges Council and staff to re-think "business as usual," to find time and money for new ideas.

For the community, the strategic plan process is another opportunity to be heard and help Council to steer the ship of local government. The strategic plan also declares what Council is trying to achieve, and invites residents, businesses, community organizations, and other agencies to get on board, and help Council to achieve its objectives. Beyond the basic ongoing services, it tells people where Council believes municipal time and money would be wisely invested.
