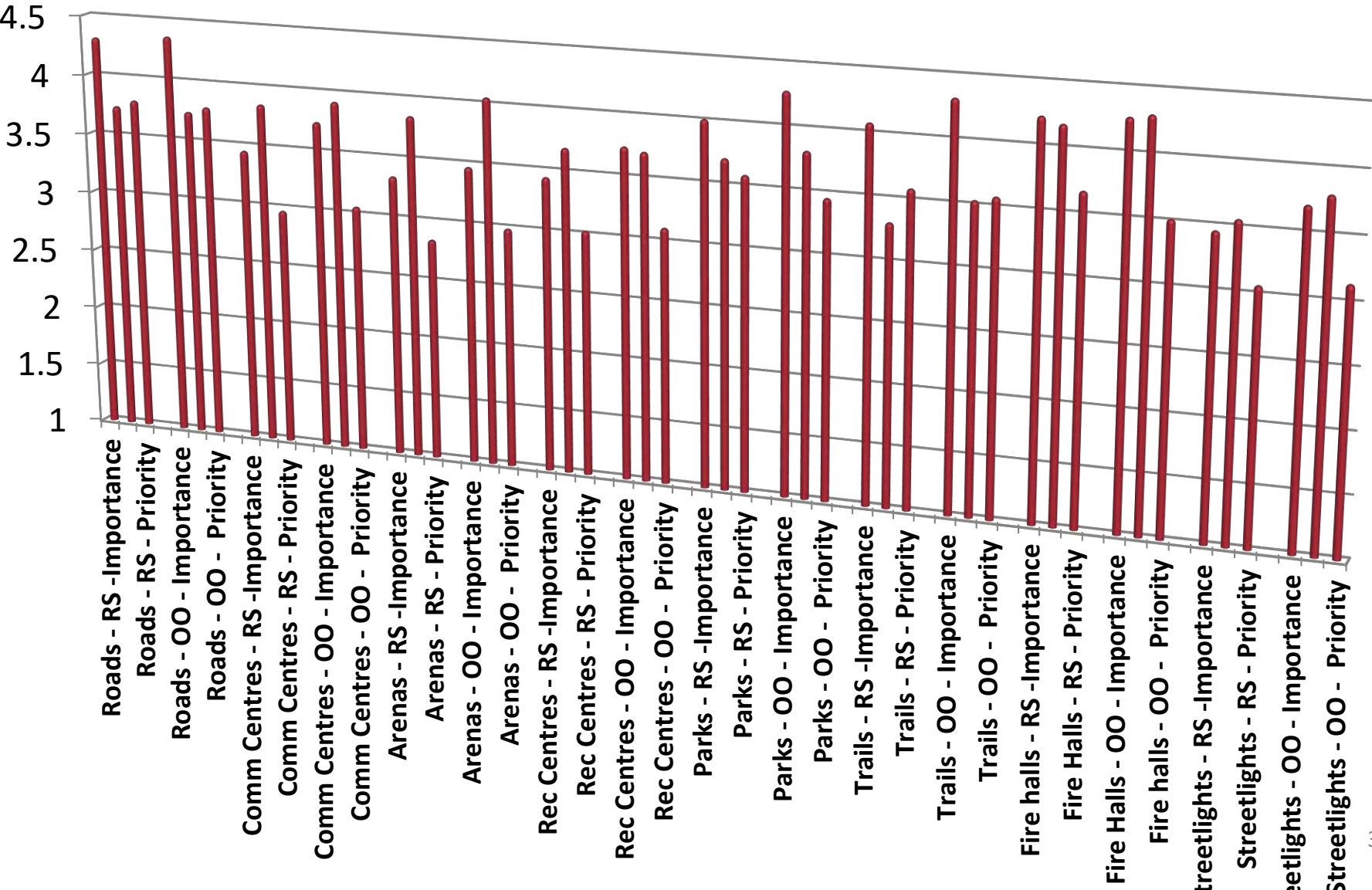

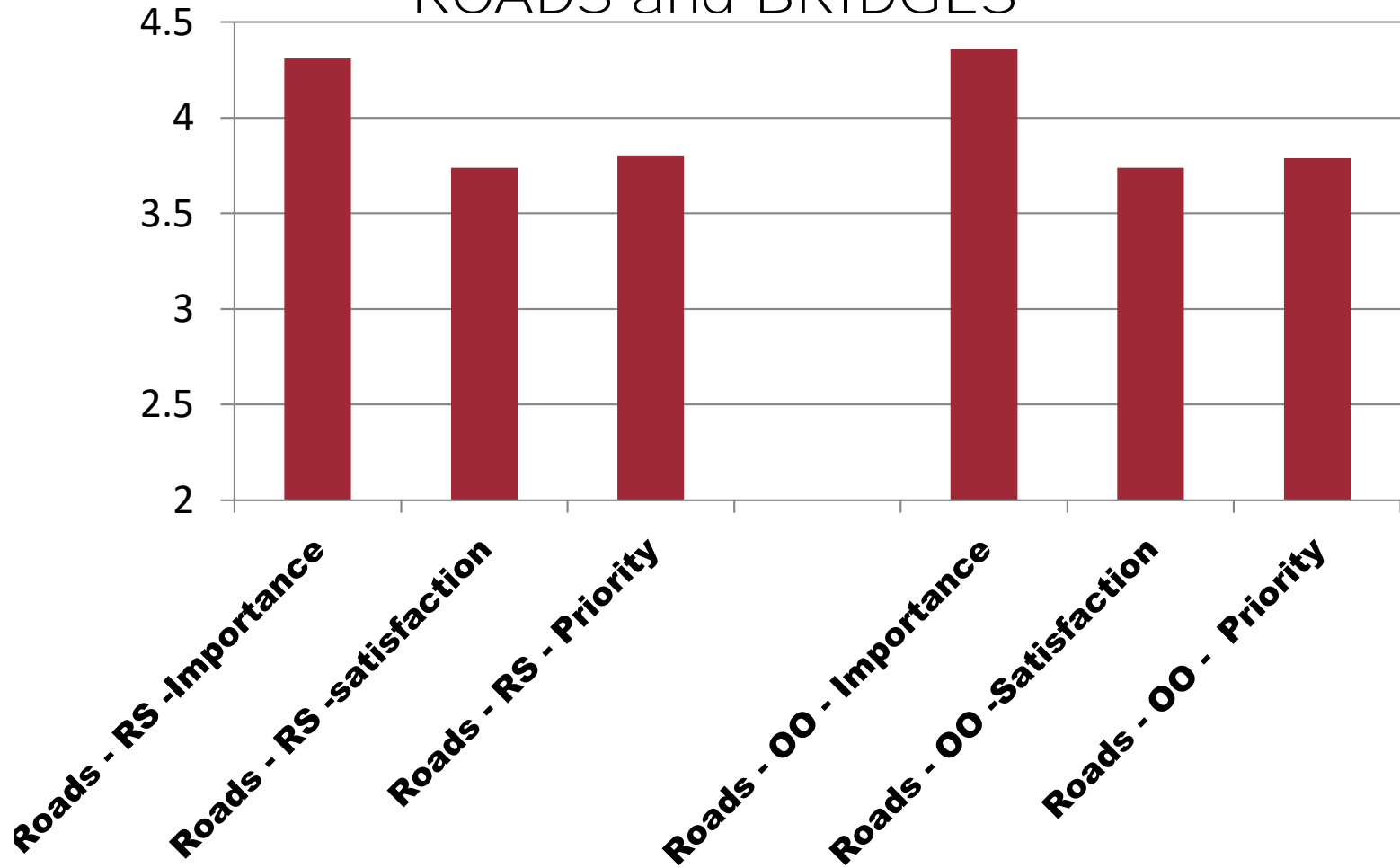

Weighted Averages - Infrastructure and Facilities

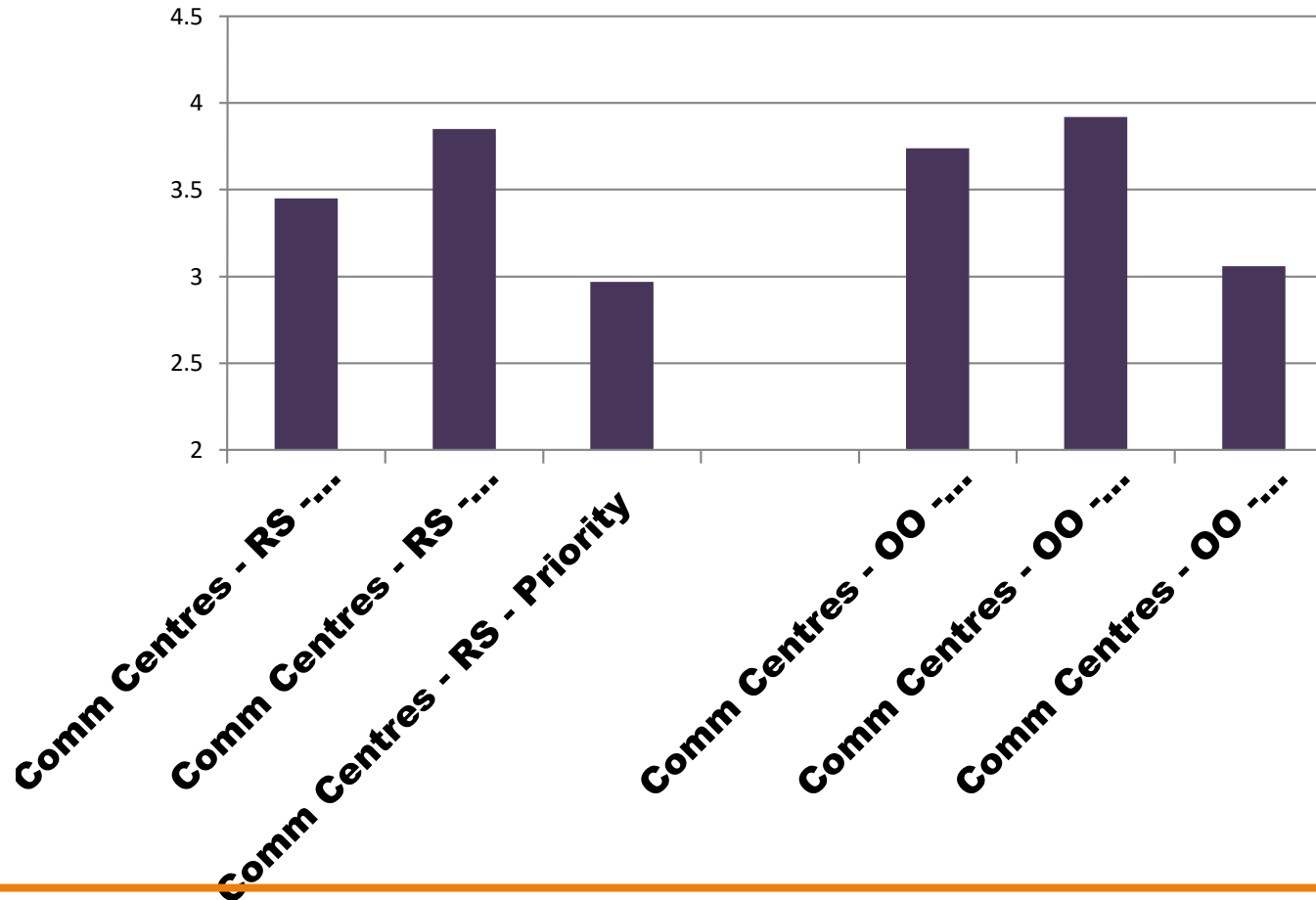


ROADS and BRIDGES

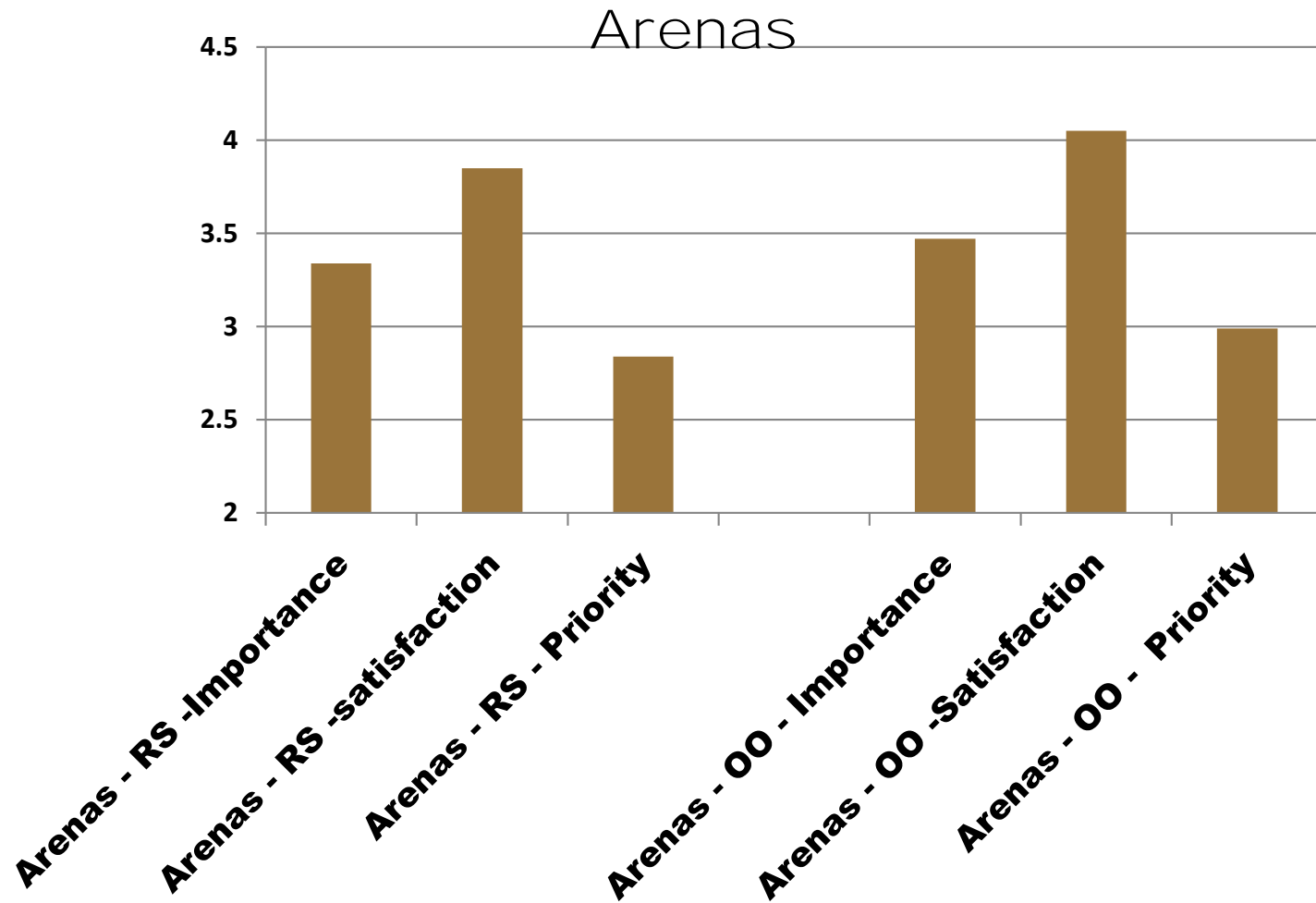


Congruence between surveys; Highly Important;
Satisfaction fairly high but doesn't match Importance;
High priority for additional Capital spending

Community Centres

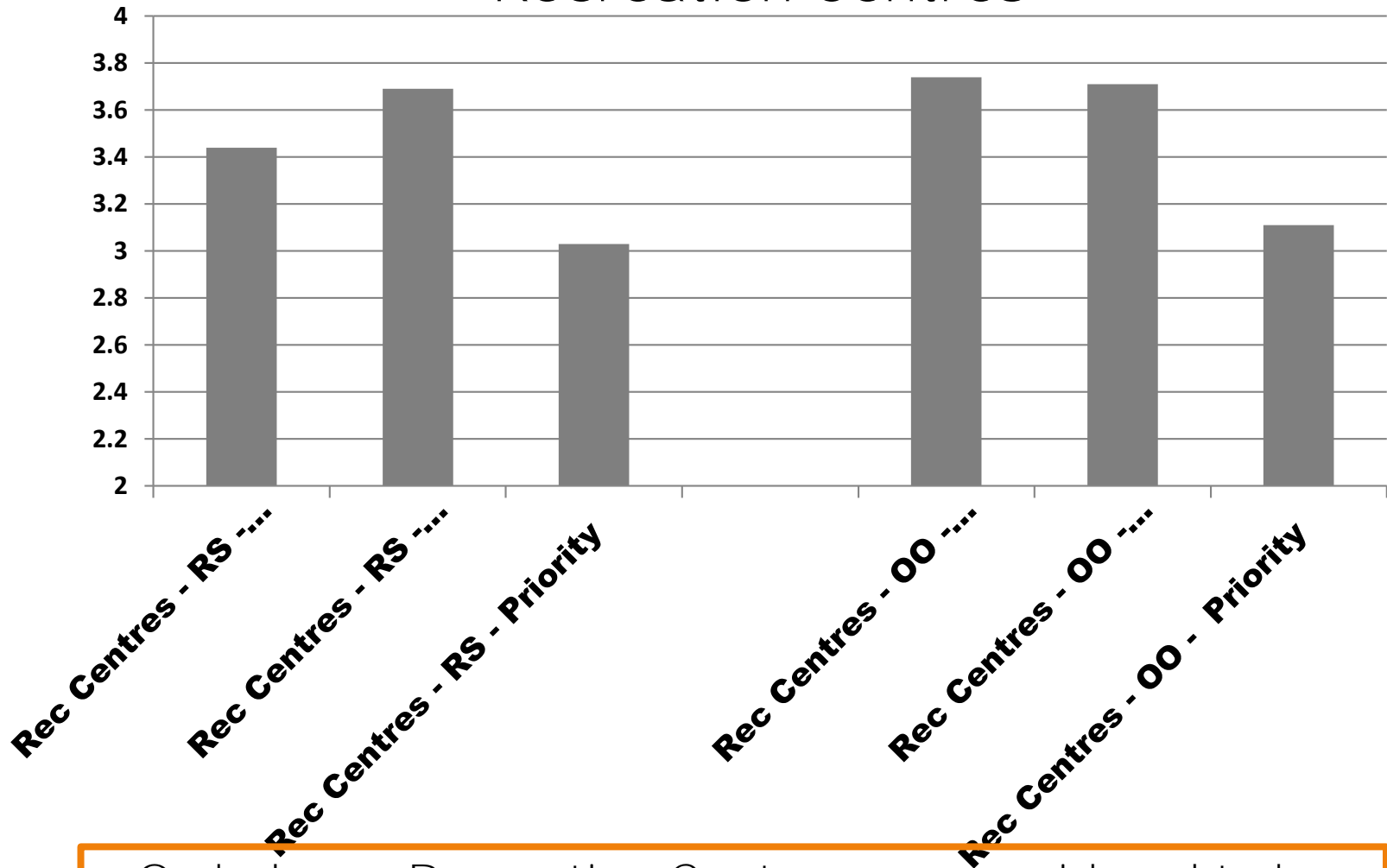


On balance community centres are considered of moderate importance (slightly higher by the Open survey), and already considered quite satisfactory. So for capital spending, the **direction is “maintain” , no more**



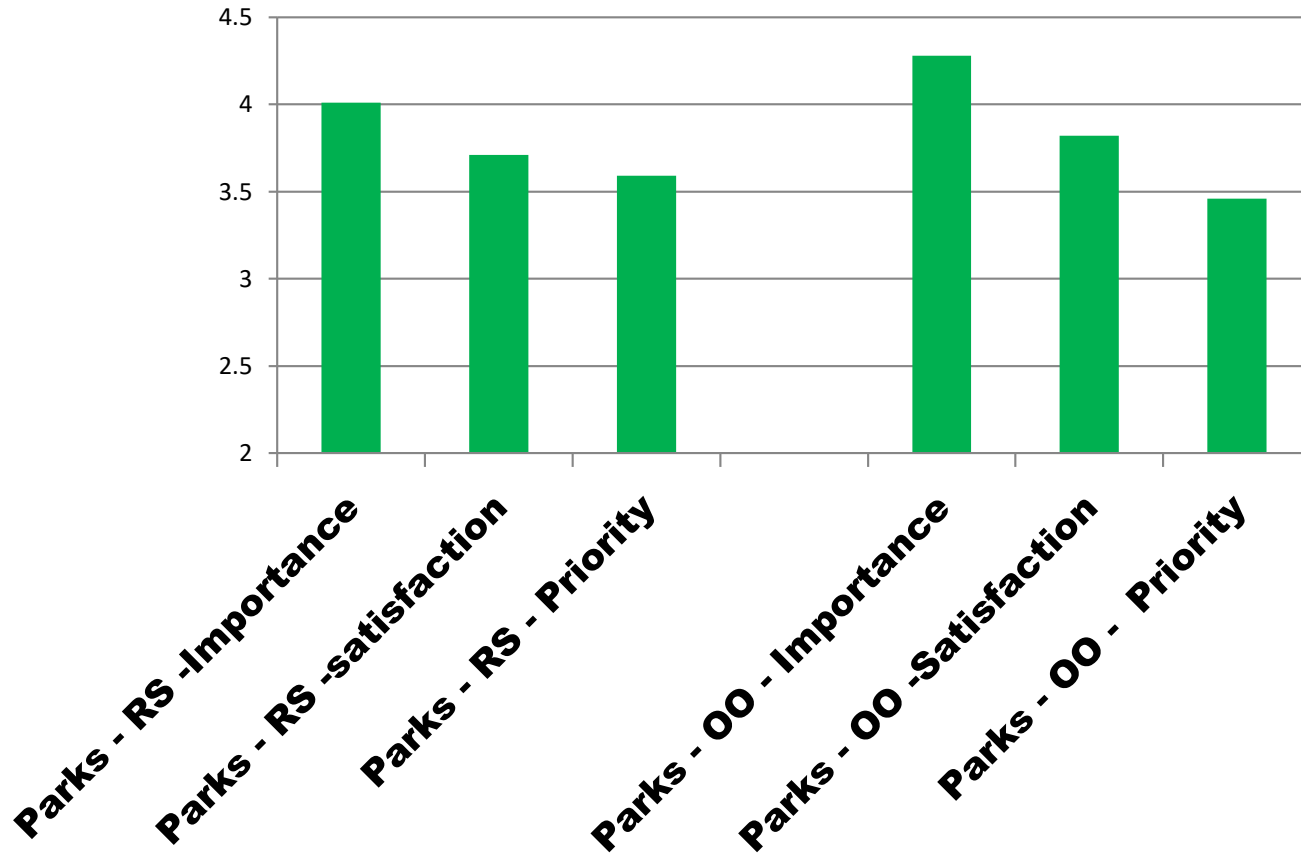
General agreement between surveys. Arenas seen to be moderately important but already quite satisfactory. Direction for capital spending is **“maintain” at most**

Recreation Centres



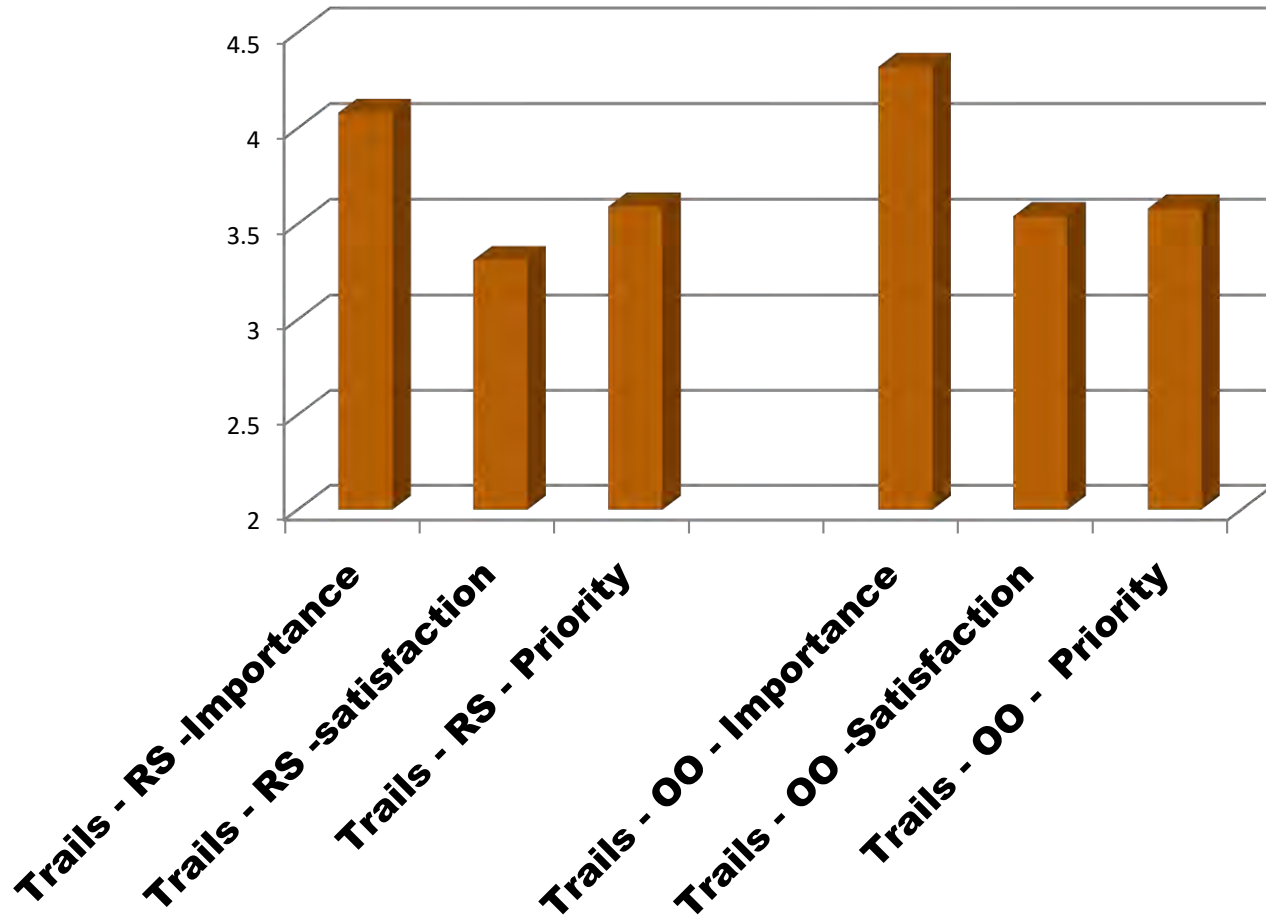
On balance Recreation Centres are considered to be moderately important (slightly more so by the Open survey) but already quite satisfactory. Direction for **capital spending is “maintain”**

Parks



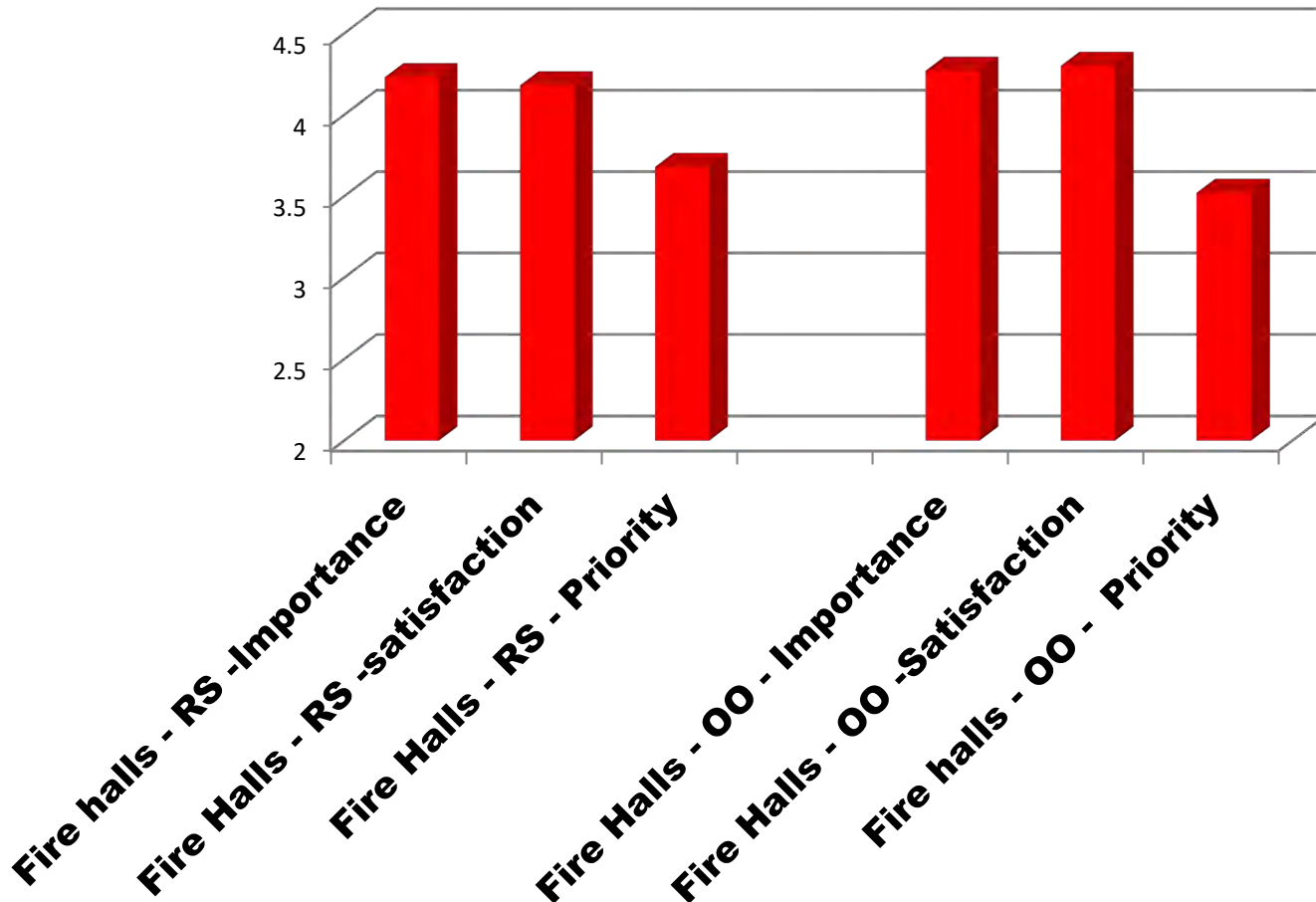
Parks considered fairly important in both surveys, and fairly satisfactory. Capital spending could include a modest increase over the status quo

Trails



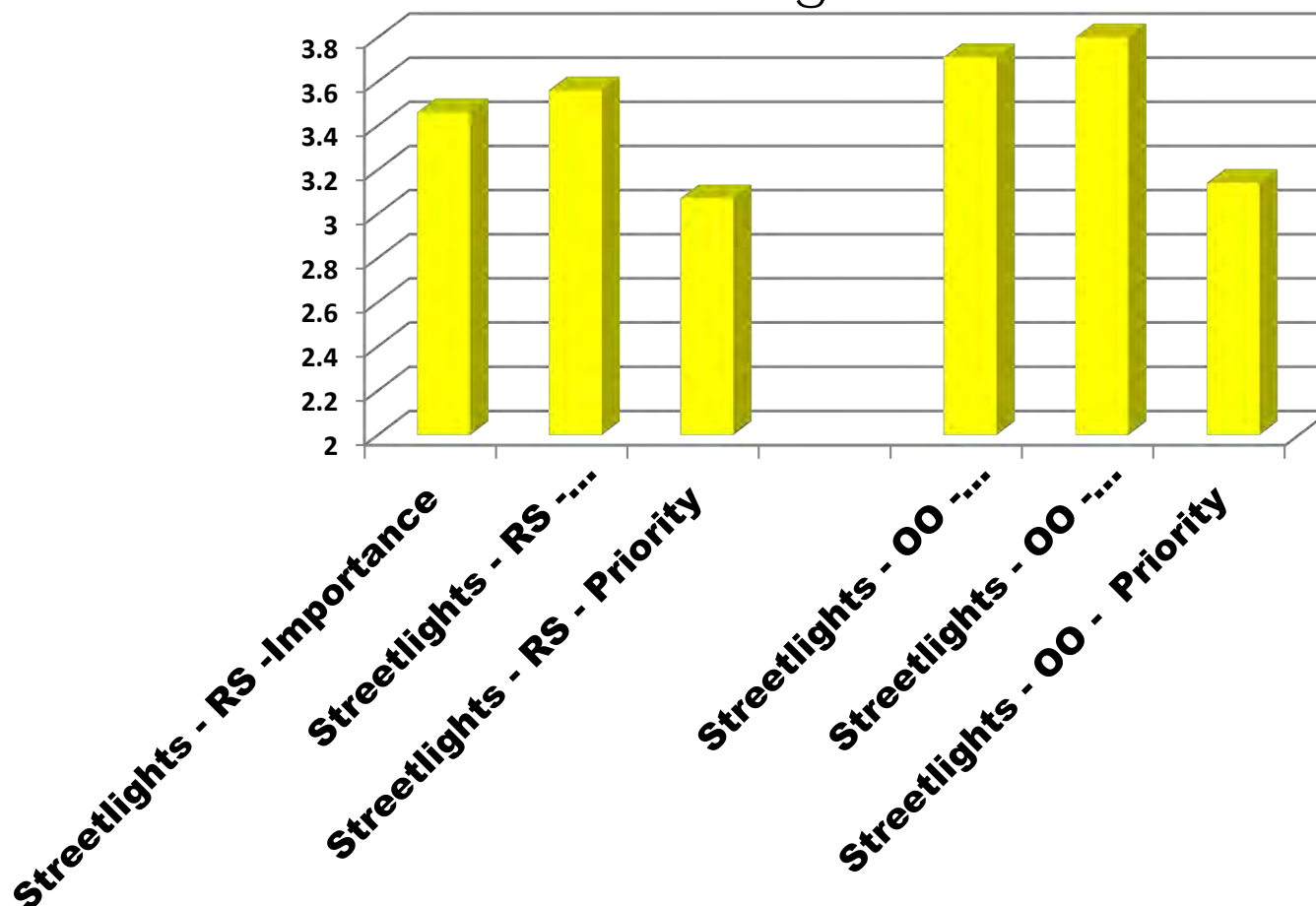
Trails considered quite important, but – particularly among the random sample – only barely satisfactory. Support for modest increase in priority for capital spending

Fire Stations



Both sets of respondents attach considerable importance to fire stations and a correspondingly high level of satisfaction. Support for some additional capital spending if needed

Streetlights



Respondents – particularly the Open survey – see streetlights to be fairly important as well as fairly **satisfactory. Capital spending direction is “Maintain”.**
